Enjoy an extensive display of embroidered samplers, religious works, Regency silk pictures, and Victorian Berlin work animals. Embroidery in fashion and the unique contribution embroidery makes to contemporary Australian art further enriches the diverse material on display in the exhibition.

A major survey of embroidery practices, **Embroidery: Oppression to Expression** is drawn extensively from South Australian public and private collections as well as superb examples collected by David Roche over his lifetime. Many never exhibited before.
