Stories in music to star at our February lecture

Our February lecture sees the return of popular local lecturer, Dr Richard Vaudrey, who – with his cello – will explore why, as humans, we use music as a story telling device.

From J.S Bach's rhetoric phrasing, Rimsky Korsakov's timbral painting and Taylor Swift's lyric imagery, Dr Vaudrey unpacks how in every sound, word and rhythm we can connect an element of story telling.

Music will include Edward Elgar's *Cello Concerto in E Minor*, J.S Bach's *Suites for Unaccompanied Cello*, Sergei Prokofiev's *Peter and the Wolf* and Rimksy Korsakov's *Scherezade*.



After returning to Australia after six years of performing in New York City, cellist Richard Vaudrey has become a notable force in the new breed of string players - classically trained and proficient across a multitude of genres.

Living on the Mornington Peninsula, Richard was a scholarship holder at The Australian National Academy of Music before heading to the United States, where he completed his Doctoral study in classical cello performance and contemporary improvisation.

Richard has had a prolific background in chamber music and performs regularly both as a soloist and collaborator across a multitude of genres including classical, new music, jazz, folk and pop.


