Our next lecture features women artists at war

Lecturer Gavin Fry will discuss three official women war artists at our lecture on 27 May - at the Peninsula Community Centre at the Craigie Road

venue (location map HERE)

Just three women worked as Official War Artists during World War II: Nora Heysen (one of her paintings is at right), Stella Bowen and Sybil Craig. They each produced a significant body of work, bringing a fresh vision to the official expression of Australia at War.

Gavin Fry (below) is a writer, artist and museum professional with 50 years' experience working in curatorial and management positions in Australian museums, galleries, and educational institutions.

He is the author of 25 books on Australian art and history and many catalogue and journal essays.



In retirement Gavin has returned to his art training and exhibits as a painter in Newcastle and Melbourne.



As well as working as a professional writer, he also designs and publishes books on behalf of other writers and artists.

Gavin holds the degrees of Bachelor of Arts [Hons] and Master of Arts from Monash University and Master of Philosophy from Leicester University.

It includes show competitions, agility trials and heelwork to music. The latter competition shows the world's best dogs and their trainers performing complex dancing routines.


Broadway and Beyond: Mornington Peninsula Chorale


