It was during the 18th century that the rituals of tea drinking were established. The painter William Hogarth, famous for recording middle class life, shows us exactly how tea was drunk at the time. In the 19th century at the seaside resorts one enjoyed the tea-dance, while on the great transatlantic passenger liners everything stopped for tea at 4.00pm

FROM MIAMI TO MERRICKS: 'The Rise and Role of the Modern Sculpture Park' Presented by GEOFFREY EDWARDS (ADFAS President)



As one of the oldest art forms, monumental sculpture has been presented in spectacular outdoor settings since antiquity. The idea of a park or garden conceived expressly for the display of sculpture is essentially a modern phenomenon. This talk is an account of the creation from the midtwentieth century.

This scandalous and sometimes vicious painter produced work with cinematic compositions and intensely visceral details. His downfall has the making of a great film and despite dying prematurely his canvases influenced a generation

SATURDAY 17 AUGUST

1.ALCHEMY AND ADVENTURE:

'A History of Exotic Colours and Poisonous Pigments' Presented by LYNNE GIBSON (Overseas Speaker)



Before organic chemistry desirable pigments were rare, exotic, or poisonous and sourced worldwide. Alchemists prepared deadly King's Yellow, mysterious Vitriol of Venus and Moorish Gold. Artists kept their paint recipes closely guarded.

2.THE ART OF SEDUCTION:

Courtly love blossomed in Medieval manuscripts and the Renaissance provided a cast of amorous gods. Puritanical Dutch and Victorians tutted over 'fallen' women while Rococo artists revelled in flirtatious fun. But has the spirit of romance died?

HEALING POWER OF PLANTS:

'Why Plant Derived Treatments are not an Alternative, instead they are the Real Thing'

Presented by TIMOTHY WALKER (Overseas Speaker)



Mankind has exploited the medicinal properties of plants for thousands of years, yet the role of plants in modern medicine is still considered peripheral. This talk puts the record straight to show that plant products are used every day to relieve pain and suffering, to heal wounds and cure diseases.

PICTURING THE BARBARIAN IN ANTIQUITY

Presented by ANDREW GILLETT (Australian speaker)



The Barbarian was central to classical Antiquity. Portrayals of barbarians appeared in every type of decorative medium, and became more pervasive as time progressed, supporting claims of imperial rule. But the classical Barbarian was very different from our modern concept, in sometimes shocking ways which we will explore in this talk.

SATURDAY 2 NOVEMBER

GEORGIA O'KEEFFE'S GROUND - BREAKING VISION

Presented by DEBORAH JENNER (Overseas speaker)



O'Keeffe's inspiration comes from hiking along canyons of America's Southwest to portray vistas from within gorges. Her compositions telescope distances and create metaphorical openings onto the Infinite. Such a sublime approach to realist and abstract painting demonstrates how her New World images disregard the European landscape genre to recall Chinese scroll painting.
