CLARE BLATHERWICK The Story of the Cullinan Diamond Mine

Clare is an independent jewellery consultant with over 20 years' experience in the industry. She spent 10 years as Head of Jewellery for Bonhams in Scotland, which involved travelling internationally searching for unique jewels to auction. Clare has a passion for the historical aspect of jewellery and lectures widely on this in both the U.K and the U.S Clare is also a member of the Society of Jewellery Historians.



This talk deals with the fascinating story of a diamond mine in South Africa that remains the source of the largest piece of diamond rough in history. From the creation of diamonds deep within the earth's crust to images taken by the speaker as she travelled 750m underground to examine the workings of the mine and of

course a look at some of the famous diamonds it has produced, this talk gives a behind the scenes look at something most of us only ever see in shops.

2pm Thursday 21 March

SHARON FIELD Really Big Art Works- Why Do Them?

Sharon is one of our 'local heroes'. She is a botanical artist who has exhibited locally, nationally, and overseas. Awarded a residency at Bundanon, a certificate of excellence from the Botanical Art Society of the UK, a finalist in the Waterhouse Natural Science Art awards, Sharon has recently been elected Board Member of the American Society of Botanical Artists. She now travels regularly to speak at workshops and exhibitions all over Australia and overseas. Sharon has lectured previously for our society and is back by popular demand!





Why do artists create over-sized artworks? Sharon's lecture will be a unique opportunity to examine firsthand an over-sized artwork- a 9 metre, hand painted evolving scroll. This scroll has travelled the world as it has grown, pictured here in New York. What is the message behind this work called '3000 days – and counting'? A clue lies in Sharon's philosophy behind her art 'My particular interest is in the dramatic sculptural forms and patterns that nature creates which can be living or dead, large or small, coloured or bleached.'

SUSANNAH FULLERTON 'And so to bed . . .'- The Diary of Samuel Pepys and Restoration London.

Susannah has been passionate about literature for as long as she can remember. She has a BA from the University of Auckland NZ and a post-graduate degree in Victorian literature from the University of Edinburgh, Scotland. She currently teaches literature courses in Sydney and lectures regularly at the State Library of NSW and the Art Gallery of NSW. Susannah is the first recipient of an Arts Fellowship of the Royal Society of NSW and has received an OAM for services to literature. Susannah is one of our most popular Australian lecturers and spoke to us last about The Mitford Girls.



The diary of Samuel Pepys has long been considered the greatest diary in the English language. Historians have found it invaluable, but it is also a superb work of literature and the record of an extraordinary man. Founder of the modern English navy, President of the Royal Society, Member of Parliament, author of books on the navy, talented musician and composer and lover of a very large number of women, Samuel Pepys delighted in many aspects of Restoration London and recorded them all in his diary.

"And so to bed ...", Susannah Fullerton's talk on Pepys, tells of his experience of the Plague and the Great Fire, his constant womanising, his theatre-going and his dinners. Susannah loves to share her enthusiasm for this most human and delightful of diarists.

Our Young Arts Grant fundraising last year (2023) enabled ArtsNational to help Marie-Cecile's School of Music at Jerrabomberra stage its first public concert at the Queanbeyan Performing Arts Centre.
