#### **VIVIENNE LAWES**

Vivienne is an art historian, art market analyst and curator/writer who combines a hands-on career in the art business with academic research and teaching in Higher Education.

She teaches at several London-based universities and her courses at these institutions cover a variety of topics, including The Art Market, History of Western Art 1350-1970, and the History of Design 1350-1970. She writes for a wide array of publications and private clients and has been published in numerous arts journals, newspapers, catalogues, handbooks, and websites.



## ANTONI GAUDÍ I CORNET (1852-1926): MASTER BUILDER OF BARCELONA

Genius Spanish architect and designer Antoni Gaudí (1852-1926), a key figure in Catalan Modernism, stands as one of the creators of Barcelona's urban identity. Inventor of new techniques and a magpie enthusiast of all things botanical and sacred, Gaudí's most famous building, the Barcelona Church of the Sagrada Família, is Spain's most-visited monument and one of seven of the architect's works listed by UNESCO as a World Heritage site.

Building works on Sagrada Família were begun in 1882 and are still ongoing, a fact that stands in stark contrast to contemporary building projects and brings to life the nature of cathedral building in medieval Europe.
