"THAT WOMAN" or "THE DUCHESS OF STYLE" – TIME TO REASSESS WALLIS SIMPSON

presented by Anne Sebba



Saturday 9th March 2024 at 4:00 pm (please be seated by 3:45 pm)

This presentation will be held at the usual venue, St Mary's Church, 17 William Street Tewantin. Please <u>arrive early</u>, <u>between 3.30 and 3.45</u>, to enable registration before the 4:00 pm start of the lecture. Additional parking is available in Butler Street.

This lecture, illustrated with pictures of Wallis Simpson, the Duchess of Windsor, and her clothes, jewellery, and homes she lived in will explore the power she had over a King. Accused of being a spy, a prostitute, and a Nazi sympathiser, yet she turned her exile into a platform from which to become regarded as the world's best dressed woman. Was she simply a clothes horse, or did she have a heart that was misunderstood? Why was she unacceptable as Queen? After three years of research and eighty-eight years since the 1936 Abdication, it is time to reassess 'That Woman'.

Anne Sebba (biographer, historian, and author of eleven books) lectures in the UK (to the National Trust, British Library, and Imperial War Museum) and in the USA. Formerly a Reuters foreign correspondent, Anne presents on BBC Radio and television talking about her books, including biographies on Jennie Churchill, Laura Ashley, Wallis Simpson and (her latest) Ethel Rosenberg, A Cold War Tragedy published in 2021.
