

SATURDAY 14 MARCH

BETTER THAN A MIRROR Frans Hals and the Art of Portraiture Presented by ALBERT GODETZKY (international speaker)



Albert received his PhD on Haarlem Mannerism from the Courtauld Institute where he was Associate Lecturer in Early Modern Art until 2025. Albert will explain why Hals's portraits created a sensation in 17th century Holland. This talk builds on new research exploring Hals's art in historical and scientific context. His painting style and innovations influenced later generations of artists.

FROM CARNIVAL TO MASQUERADE Fashion and Fancy Dress Presented by PETER MCNEIL (Australian speaker)



Peter is a Distinguished Professor of Design History at UTS and a Fellow of the Australian Academy of Humanities. One of the most popular pastimes in the Victorian and Edwardian period was the masked costume ball where wealth could be flaunted without limit. The scandal caused by the opulence of the Bradley-Martin Ball of 1897 led to the host fleeing abroad. This talk will consider the costume ball's enduring role in art and culture.

Unearthed, by chance, in 1912 in an historic part of London, it seems it was lost, or buried, between 1640-1666. Over 400 pieces make up this remarkable hoard. These are rare, but not royal, jewels that demonstrate remarkable skills with stones mined in every part of the world. What does the collection represent?
